## CITY OF FAIRLAWN

Dear Fairlawn Residents:

Over the past thirty-six years, we have received a tremendous response to "**Bill Stalker Fairlawn Clean Up and Beautification Day**", also known as "Large Item Pick-Up Day". This service will be taking place:

**Saturday May 21, 2022**  
**7:00 a.m. – All items must be at curb**

The large item pick-up is limited to items that are difficult to dispose of through normal channels. This includes washers, dryers, mattresses, sofas, televisions, etc. If you are discarding a refrigerator, **the doors must be removed as required by state law.** Large item pick-up **DOES NOT INCLUDE:** normal trash, leaves, grass, brush, or any other yard waste, household rubbish, concrete or asphalt, heavy construction or demolition materials, paints, chemicals or any other household hazardous waste. Please make arrangements to have your large items at the curb **by 7:00 a.m. on Saturday May 21, 2022.** City crews **will not** be responsible for items placed at the curb after 7:00 a.m.

Please also note that the **31st Annual Used Motor Oil Collection Day** will also be held on **Saturday May 21, 2022** at the Andrew E. Sombati Compactor and Recycling Center. The monitors **will not** accept used motor oil mixed with any solvents.

**Compactor Decals:** Issuance of new compactor decals continues to take place online at [www.fairlawn.us](http://www.fairlawn.us). Scroll down to the "News and Announcements" area on the first page of the website and click on "Compactor Decal Registration" to complete the form. Please make sure all information is entered accurately, especially vehicle make, model and plate numbers. The new decals are vehicle specific and will be subject to random scanning by the monitors. These decals will be good for as long as you own the vehicle and will not need to be renewed each year. Please notify the Service Department if you change plates on a vehicle as your decal is connected to your plate/vehicle information. If you do not have computer access and wish to have the form mailed to you, or for other questions regarding compactor services, please contact the Department of Public Service at 330-668-9550.

**Saturday June 4, 2022** – Summit ReWorks (formerly the Summit/Akron Solid Waste Management Authority) will be offering a **Free/Secure Document Shredding Day** for residents and businesses in Summit County. Confidential recycling and shredding of your documents will take place at the Fairlawn Department of Public Service, 3300 Fairlawn Service Drive from **9:00 AM until Noon (Rain or shine)**.

There is a limit of 10 file boxes or shopping bags. Please remove any binder clips, rubber bands, paper clips, binders, report covers and hanging files. STAPLES ARE OKAY. **All** paper shredded will be recycled. If you have any questions, please contact the Service Department at 330-668-9550.



## **UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION FOR 2022**

Cleveland Massillon Road Widening Project Continues with off road work of lighting, landscaping, multiuse path concrete, and general cleanup. For updates on the project, please go to <http://fairlawn.us/CMProject> or sign up for notifications shown on the previous page for the "Notify Me" button on the City's website.

In January, Fairlawn and Summit County partnered in applying for AMATS funds to resurface portions of Cleveland Massillon Road. Survey work and engineering will be performed this year from Ridgewood Road to Kuhmo Drive and Springside Drive to 200' south of Ghent Road.

Also in January, Fairlawn partnered with the City of Akron in applying for AMATS funds to resurface Miller Road. Survey work and engineering will occur this summer.

The annual miscellaneous repair will take place this summer. Repair of deteriorated concrete slabs, catch basins, and manhole block outs will be conducted as usual. This year, asphalt resurfacing of Mackinaw Ave., Falmouth Rd., and Franz Dr. plus resurfacing of the Learning Resource Center will be part of the repair.

The engineering of the Rosemont Preserve will begin this summer along with some miscellaneous work on the removal of the concession stand and pump house.

The intersections of Shiawassee Ave./Sand Run Pkwy., Revere Rd./Sand Run Pkwy., Corunna Ave./Smith Rd. will receive traffic signal upgrades.

Summit County Engineer will resurface Smith Road.
